Greetings in the name of the Risen Lord, Jesus the Christ!

One notion about God that has stuck with me throughout the past three years or so

is the depth that God has revealed to us of Emmanuel. We as church speak often that Christmas and Easter are not simply singular days on the calendar but are seasons that give us so much depth to how much God cares for us, and all God has made and called good. These seasons give us a chance to explore and sit with the stories from of old and our current experiences in knowing God with us.

The stories that give hope in a most impactful way are those that come into our everyday experiences, those that nothing unique or otherwise noteworthy takes place that God enters and makes them special. We know of the woman at the well, the two travelers to Emmaus, and the women at the tomb not simply because what they did was so special, but how Jesus interacted with them became so. We are met by the holy and the relationship fostered therein of God working in, with, and through us gives reminders of the new life found in Christ.

The amazement comes in how we come to know Jesus. For the three examples I gave earlier, the woman at the well comes to know Jesus through his questions of her and her life. The men journeying to Emmaus come to know Jesus in the breaking of the bread. The women at the tomb know Jesus through the spoken word of Jesus' greeting to them. All of them are everyday duties or tasks that we experience in our own journey to which God enters and makes them holy.

This is our story of resurrection and new life. This is what gives Easter the impact it does: God comes into our lives in the everyday and gives us a holy experience. That is how much God cares for you, for me, and for all creation. God comes into our lives each and every day to make them holy. We are invited to recognize the holy in our midst and share it with those who are having a hard time seeing it or have lost the ability to see it.

Continue in the new life that God enters. It happens each day in ways we cannot predict or sometimes explain.

Notice of proposed changes to Endowment Bylaws

The Endowment Committee has requested some changes to the bylaws as shown:

PLAN OF OPERATION

1. THE COMMITTEE

The COMMITTEE shall consist of five (5) members, all of whom shall be voting members of Zion Lutheran Church. Except as herein limited, the term of each member shall be three (3) years. <u>Upon adoption of this resolution by the congregation, it shall elect five (5) members to the COMMITTEE: two (2) for a term of three (3) years; two (2) for a term of two (2) years and one (1) for a term of one (1) year. No member shall serve more than two (2) consecutive three (3) year terms. After lapse of one (1) year, former COMMITTEE members may be re-elected. A pastor of the congregation and the president of the Church Council shall be advisory members of the COMMITTEE. The congregation shall nominate and elect the COMMITTEE. In the event of a vacancy on the COMMITTEE, the Church Council shall appoint a member to fill the vacancy until the term is completed.</u>

Proposed change: to strike the underlined and replace it with the following:

The congregation shall elect members on a staggered rotation over three consecutive years, 3 in one year, 2 members in a second year, and 0 members in the third year.

The COMMITTEE shall elect from its membership a chairperson, financial secretary and recording secretary, HEREIN KNOWN AS THE OFFICERS OF THE COMMITTEE. The chairperson, or member designated by the chairperson, shall preside at all COMMITTEE meetings.

Proposed change: inserts the capitalized words HEREIN KNOWN AS THE OFFICERS OF THE COMMITTEE to the existing paragraph.

The financial secretary shall maintain complete and accurate books of accounts for the FUND <u>and shall sign checks and all necessary documents of behalf of the congregation in furtherance of the purposes of the FUND.</u> The books shall be audited annually by an appropriate person(s) who is not a member of the COMMITTEE.

Proposed change: to strike the underlined and replace it with the following new paragraph:

The Officers will be responsible for all necessary documents on behalf of the congregation in furtherance of the purposes of the FUND. Checks that disburse funds to successful applicants shall be signed by two of the Officers.

Notice of proposed change to Constitution

This has been suggested by the Synod to allow Zoom meetings of the congregation. It would form a new and final article in Chapter 10, followed by Chapter 11.

C10.08. This congregation may hold meetings by remote communication, including electronically and by telephone conference, as long as there is an opportunity for simultaneous aural communication or its equivalent. To the extent permitted by state law, notice of all meetings may be provided electronically.

The above changes have been approved by the Council and will be presented to the congregation for a vote at the Annual Meeting to be held June 11, 2023.

Changes to the constitution must:

C17.02.b. . . . be ratified without change at the next annual meeting by a two-thirds majority vote of those present and voting; and have the effective date included in the resolution and noted in the constitution.

C17.03. Any amendments to this constitution shall be sent by the secretary of this congregation to the synod. The amendment shall become effective within 120 days from the date of the receipt of the notice by the synod unless the synod informs this congregation that the amendment is in conflict with the constitution and bylaws of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, or the constitution of the SW Washington Synod.

C16.02. Bylaws may be adopted or amended at any legally called meeting of this congregation with a quorum present by a majority vote of those voting members present and voting.

The Thursday morning group




has started a new study, Timeline of the Old Testament, which begins 10:00 am in the
