It's school kit time!

Why school supplies? To the children who receive School Kits, **these supplies mean the difference between getting an education or not.** Public school is usually free, but in the places where LWR works, even a few required supplies, like pens and paper, may be more than many families can afford. You can help by collecting items for the kits.

Needed for each kit:

- Four 70-sheet notebooks of wide or college-ruled paper approximately 8" X 10½"; no loose-leaf paper
- One pencil sharpener
- One 2½" eraser
- One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- Five ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- One box of 16 or 24 Crayola crayons (other brands melt)

mid-day break with food and fun. All ladies are welcome!

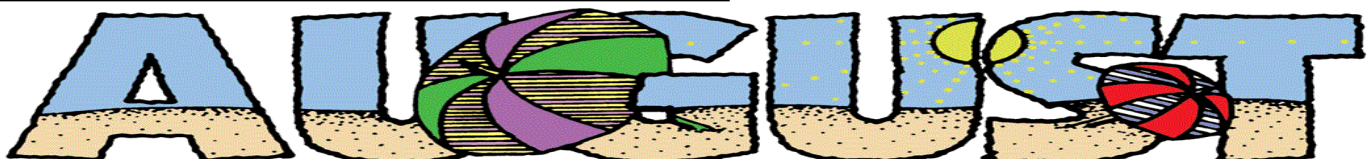
Zionettes will meet for a trip to the Farmers' Market

Sunday School begins September 9 with the return to the fall schedule!

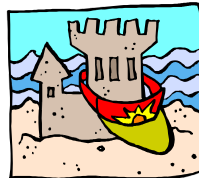
