Prayer of Confession: Renew and Transform Us

Blessed be the holy Trinity, + one God, now and forever whose steadfast love is everlasting, whose faithfulness endures from generation to generation. *Amen.*

Trusting in the mercy of God, let us confess our sin.

Merciful God, we confess that we have not always lived up to the example set by Your Son, Jesus Christ. In Your mercy, hear our prayer of confession.

We confess how difficult it is to truly love the people around us; to care as deeply for their well-being as for our own, to delight in their good fortune without feeling envious. We do not truly understand how to love our neighbors as ourselves.

Forgive us. Teach us to whole-heartedly love one another.

We confess how often we act out of our own self-interest; putting our needs and desires ahead of the needs of others, hoarding our resources rather than sharing them freely.

Forgive us. Teach us to live with generosity and compassion.

We confess that we find it very difficult to love our enemies: to pray for their well-being, to leave thoughts of vengeance behind.

Forgive us for not forgiving. Teach us to forgive our trespassers.

You call us to turn away from the behaviors and attitudes of the world around us; and to be renewed and transformed by Your grace at work in our lives. Through Your Holy Spirit, continue the work that You have begun in us, so that our words and deeds may bring honor and glory to You. In Jesus' name we pray, *Amen*.
