

**January 13, 2022: Fifty Words for Rain** by Asha Lemmie. Pat Edwards will lead discussion and we will meet at her house again.



## **Zion Call Committee Update**

At the time of this writing (mid-December) the Zion Call Committee is not actively considering any candidates for our next pastor. There are currently no candidates available. We are continually consulting with the Southwestern Washington Synod of the ELCA to seek additional candidates.

The following is a brief recap of the Call Committee's progress and past activities. After a period of congregational discernment, the members of Zion elected a Call Committee in August. As a reminder, the members of your Call Committee are Marilyn Anderson, Florence Farone, Dave Hagensen, John Hansen, Adam Sitler, and Cheryl Sonju. September was spent getting the committee organized and consulting with Pastor Rebecca Shjerven, the Bishop's Associate from the Synod. We initially received three candidates from Pastor Rebecca, and we decided to interview all three. After prayerful deliberation, we decided to offer a second interview to one of the candidates. That candidate decided to decline a second interview with us. Thus, we arrived at our current state where there are no available candidates.

We are hopeful that additional pastors will consider a move to Zion as we progress into 2022. As soon as we receive a candidate from the Synod, we will rapidly begin our deliberation and interview process. We ask for your prayers that the Holy Spirit will guide our congregation through this time of transition.
