It was light enough to see but the sun wasn't warming yet, the stalks with their suddenly awakened bugs fell on me instead of the empty space in front, and that machete began to weigh a ton.

I had to admit that I had lost control of my life even in this little way and that I'd better let go of all my vacation notions and let God show me the way down the corn row.

Dinner at the WHO Feb. 27-Mar 5

Zion's outreach to WHO (Winter Hospitality Overflow) has been generous! The response to donations needed instead of sign-ups to work at St. Paul was \$2563.75 in 2021. Now, a week to provide meals presents a new opportunity to serve as Jesus' hands and feet among the thirty men spending nights off the street.

February 27-March 5 Zion has been asked to provide an evening meal to be delivered at 6:00 pm at St. Paul. Nora Cobb, Zion's kitchen coordinator, has graciously agreed to prepare the entree. Zion family, your help is needed for seven nights to provide, *per night*, three family size salads (no dressing for green salad), three dozen rolls and assorted desserts, as well as donations to purchase groceries and people to deliver each night's food to the shelter. From the Pasture...This is no way to start a ministry?

I write the newsletter article a couple of days before my first opportunity to preside with the Zion community. We will be under serious COVID restrictions...no singing, N95 masks, no participants. The infection rate in Clark County has doubled in the past week. This is no way to start this new pastoral ministry.

Recognizing all the challenges we face as a church and community, it is easy to understand people's frustrations and deep sadness at not being together in person. COVID fatigue is a real thing and most of us are experiencing it. I am not telling you anything new. And we have an obligation to make sure that the most vulnerable are safe, that unvaccinated children are protected, and our elders have all their concerns dealt with. Zion needs to appreciate what the COVID Taskforce deals with in this ever changing environment.

With all the hassles, this may also be a time to step up as followers of Christ and think about what Jesus asks of us. I always find this question a little dangerous because I often won't like what Jesus will say.

In times like these, Jesus would want compassion for the "other" to take the place of fear. Putting the other person's wellness and safety over my personal choices or discomfort seems like something Jesus would say. Kindness and care to the other would be a priority; meaning we need to be in communication (and when possible connection) with that person. As you think of friends you are not able to be with, give them a call, drop a note, send a text or email that you have been thinking about them and miss them. Drop off a meal or flowers or a balloon. Jesus would remind us to be generous...give to Treasure House, provide a meal to someone who lives alone (*e.g. give them a call and place it on the doorstep*). Get vaccinated for others if not for yourself.

Being a Christian is about believing in God and Christ's church. It is also about being the Body of Christ the world. Compassion, care for the other, staying connected, kindness, reaching out, generosity

and healing are all things that Jesus did. Maybe this is the way for us together to start our ministry.

Zion Call Committee Update
